





Dedication

Horry-Georgetown Technical College proudly hosted a building dedication ceremony on Tuesday, July 29th to mark the official opening of its new Nursing & Health Sciences Institute on the Grand Strand Campus. The \$15 million state-of-the-art facility represents a significant investment in healthcare education and workforce development for the region.

Located at 770 Swallow Avenue in Myrtle Beach, the 20,000-square-foot expansion transforms HGTC's historic Building 100, originally constructed in 1960 as part of the Myrtle Beach Air Force Base, into a modern simulation and training center. Designed to support students across all 18 healthcare programs, the facility places a strong focus on nursing and emergency medical services (EMS), while fostering collaborative, cross-functional training that reflects real-world healthcare environments for both students and industry partners.

HGTC welcomed distinguished guests to the dedication event, including members of the HGTC Area Commission, HGTC faculty and staff, members of the South Carolina Legislative Delegation, and South Carolina Lieutenant Governor Pamela Evette, who also participated in the groundbreaking ceremony in 2024.



"The completion of the new Nursing & Health Sciences Institute marks a milestone moment for HGTC and the communities we serve," said Dr. Marilyn "Murph" Fore, HGTC President. "This investment allows us to increase healthcare student enrollment, expand programming, and provide innovative, hands-on training that meets the needs of today's healthcare workforce. We are grateful to all our partners and supporters who helped bring this vision to life."

The expanded facility is designed to increase HGTC's nursing program enrollment to 600 students by 2030 and provide professional development and clinical rotation opportunities for regional healthcare employers. HGTC's goal is to continue strengthening its role as a leader in healthcare education and workforce development across Horry and Georgetown counties.

Key contributors to the project include Conway Medical Center, McLeod Health, the Chapin Foundation, Bank of America, Truist Foundation, the Draughn family, and the Myrtle Beach Air Force Base Redevelopment Authority.

MARINE TECHNOLOGY INSTITUTE OF SOUTH CAROLINA

On Friday, April 11, 2025, Horry-Georgetown Technical College broke ground on the new Marine Technology Institute of South Carolina, a 25,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art training facility that will serve as the new home for the College's Outboard Marine Technology and Boat Building Technology programs.

"This groundbreaking marks a significant milestone for HGTC, our students, and South Carolina's thriving marine industry," said Dr. Marilyn "Murph" Fore, President of HGTC. "As demand for skilled marine technicians and boat builders continues to grow, this facility will allow us to expand our programs, increase enrollment, and provide cutting-edge workforce training to meet industry needs."

The Marine Technology Institute of South Carolina is strategically located near Winyah Bay, in the heart of South Carolina's coastline, making it the ideal site for this first-of-its-kind facility in the state. The project will double enrollment in the Outboard Marine Technology program from 24 to 48



students annually while also introducing the Boat Building Technology program, which will train 24 students per year in foundational skills such as composite construction and structural reinforcements.

South Carolina is home to one of the most robust boating industries in the United States, with 567,000 registered boats, 30 boat builders, and over 656 marine-related businesses employing 155,000 people. The marine and fishing industry contributes 3.1% of the state's GDP, highlighting the critical need for skilled workers to sustain and grow this sector. HGTC's new facility will serve as a leading hub for marine technology training, equipping students with the skills necessary to support this high-demand industry. As Yamaha's only college-level partner in South Carolina and a flagship partner across the U.S., HGTC is proud to continue its tradition of excellence with the only outboard marine and boat building training curriculum in the technical college system and the state.

The HGTC Pantry provides non-perishable food and personal care items to meet the needs of anyone affiliated with HGTC, free and confidentially. The HGTC Pantry also provides links and information on additional resources provided within our HGTC community and surrounding community to ensure access to healthy food and personal care, community education and advocacy that leads to self-sufficiency and a brighter tomorrow.

Today, the Pantry provides non-perishable food and personal care items to students and employees through a system created to ensure confidentiality and quick service. We seek to bridge the gap between adequate nutrition and student success. Information on neighboring services is shared with Pantry Users, as well as connections to HGTC student services such as advising, tutoring, career and veteran resources.

In the past year, HGTC Pantry logged 1,288 visits, an increase of 43% over the prior year. We are extremely grateful to the 24 volunteers and 3 Work Study Students that maintain operations and donations.

College leadership, faculty, staff and students are instrumental in collecting items for the pantry. The HGTC Foundation fully supports the Pantry by raising funds and assisting with proper documentation for donations. We thank HGTC employees and the Foundation Board of Directors for their personal contributions this year!


